Dr. Teresa A. Gonzalez serves as Vice Provost for Academic Programs and Professor of Graduate Psychology at James Madison University. She was formerly Associate Vice President for Student Affairs. Her primary responsibilities include oversight of curriculum development/approval, academic policy, academic review process as well as being liaison from the Provost to major university and state higher education groups.
